Bachelor of Science Teacher Education- PreK-3

The Elementary Teacher Preparation program is highlighted by the interaction of content knowledge and pedagogical skills in effective teaching. Students will engage in clinical experiences throughout the program as they plan, deliver, and reflect on learning activities with children at the Pre-Kindergarten—3rd grade levels. Graduates are equipped to teach literacy, mathematics, science, and social studies to students in grades PreK-3 in a self-contained classroom or departmentalized setting, with an emphasis on literacy and mathematics instruction. The standards for the PreK-3 program include integration and instruction to meet the needs of the whole child leading to a well-rounded education. Students can also opt to add a Learning Disabilities special education endorsement.
