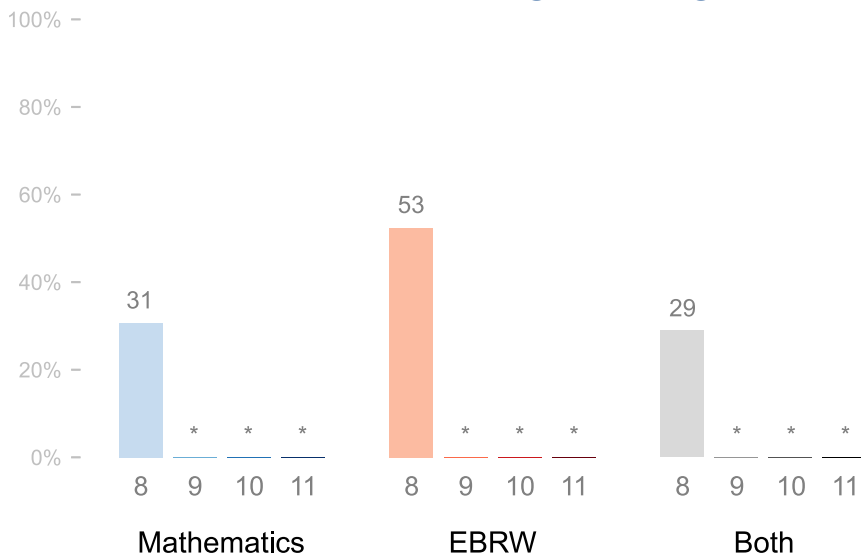
ELA & Math Proficiency Trend (%)



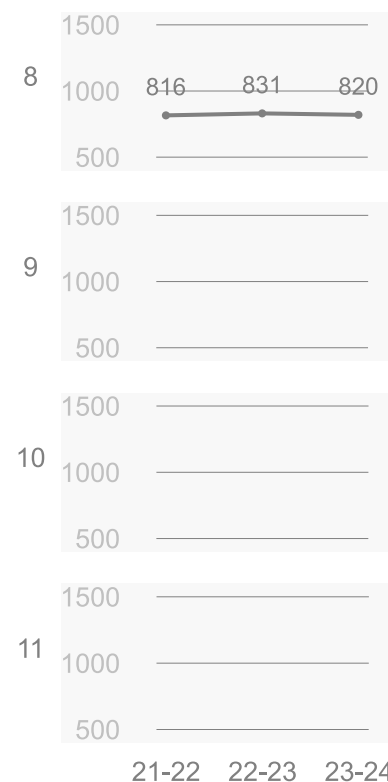

Student Conditional Growth Percentiles

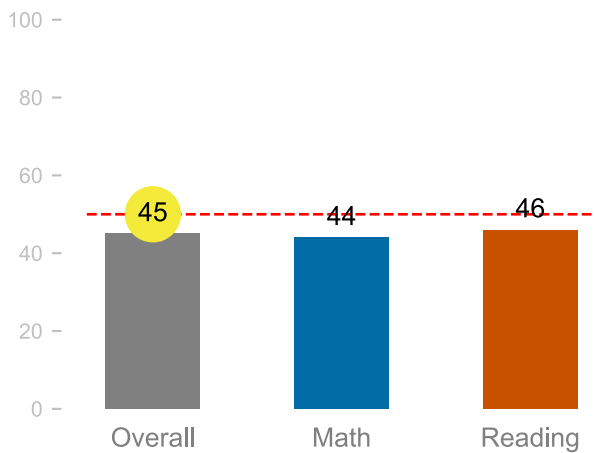

NWEA SCGP Trend

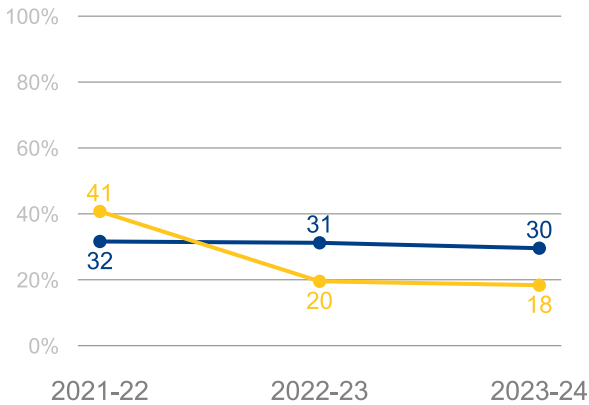
